REGULATIONS OF THE 2026 LITHUANIAN STUDENT GRECO-ROMAN WRESTLING CHAMPIONSHIP

I. AIMS AND OBJECTIVES

1. To develop and promote Greco-Roman wrestling by organizing the Lithuanian Students' Championship.
2. To identify the strongest higher education institution teams and athletes.
3. The championship shall be conducted in accordance with the competition rules approved by the International Wrestling Federation (UWW), as well as the statutes and regulations of the Lithuanian Student Sports Association (LSSA).

II. ORGANIZATION AND CONDUCT

4. The championship is organized by the Lithuanian Student Sports Association and conducted by Kaunas Wrestling Club "LOKIAI" and Marijampolė Sports Center.
5. The person responsible for athlete safety during the competition is Chief Referee Karolis Čiupkevičius, and Chief Secretary Valdemaras Venckaitis.

III. TIME AND PLACE

6. The championship will take place on April 11, 2026, at the Marijampolė Sports Center gym, address: P. Armino St. 94K, Marijampolė. Start of the competition – 14:00.

IV. PARTICIPANTS

7. **LSSA members whose student athletes meet the following criteria may participate in the championships:**
 - 7.1. Athletes participating in the championship must have valid certificates issued by the Agency or an International Sports Federation confirming completion of anti-doping education.
 - 7.2. citizens of Lithuania and foreign countries who are studying at Lithuanian educational institutions.
 - 7.3. studying at a higher education institution under a study program or in doctoral studies;
 - 7.4. foreign students studying under the Erasmus study program;
 - 7.5. students on academic leave;
 - 7.6. students who graduated from a university within the past year may represent only the higher education institution they graduated from, upon submission of a copy of their diploma;
 - 7.7. an athlete studying at more than one higher education institution may represent only one chosen institution for the entire academic year;
 - 7.8. There is no age limit (unless otherwise specified in the regulations of the sport).
 - 7.9. **For LSSA members, the entry fee is EUR 10 per person.** An invoice shall be issued to the higher education institution based on properly submitted applications, either by the next quarter or semester, according to the needs of the institution.
8. **Participation conditions for non-LSSA members:**
 - 8.1. Individual athletes (affiliated with an educational institution), higher education institutions or other educational institutions that are not members of LSSA may participate in the championship as full participants, i.e., they are eligible for awards; however, their points are not counted toward the team standings.
 - 8.2. **For non-LSSA members, the entry fee is €20 per person.** The invoice will be issued before the championship, after contacting the contact person provided in the regulations.
9. In LSSA events, in accordance with the recommendations of the Ministry of Education, Science and Sport of the Republic of Lithuania, citizens of Russia and Belarus, as well as athletes and administrators having legal, commercial, governmental, or political ties with legal entities of Russia or Belarus, are not permitted to participate.



V. CHAMPIONSHIP PROCEDURE

10. The higher education institution or organizer conducting the student competitions is responsible for: the opening and closing of the competition (including the student anthem 'Gaudeamus igitur'), team presentations, and the award ceremony.
11. The sports competition shall be conducted strictly in accordance with the regulations.
12. After the championship, the competition organizers (Chief Referee or Chief Secretary) must submit a report, properly formatted electronic results, and other required documents to the LSSA no later than 2 working days after the event.

VI. CHAMPIONSHIP PROGRAM

13. Program:
12:30–13:30 – arrival, registration, weigh-in, accreditation.
14:00 – start of the championship.

VII. DETERMINATIONS OF WINNERS

14. Competition format: individual-team.
15. Competition format: individual and team.
Weight categories: 60 kg, 67 kg, 77 kg, 82 kg, 87 kg, 97 kg, 130 kg.
16. The number of participants is not limited. For the team standings, the results of the 7 best team members are counted, with no more than 2 athletes per weight category.
17. Team rankings are determined based on the total points earned by participants. Team standings are calculated only among universities that are LSSA members.
18. Points are awarded as follows: 1st place – 17, 2nd – 15, 3rd – 14 points, etc., down to 16th place – 1 point.
19. Athletes who did not compete in any match (i.e., weighed in but did not compete) receive 50% of the points assigned for their place.
20. In case of a tie between teams, priority is given to the team with more 1st places, then 2nd places, etc.

VIII. AWARDS

21. The team placing 1st, 2nd, or 3rd in the team classification will receive a team trophy, and the team leader will be awarded a medal and a prize.
22. Winners of the individual standings are awarded medals and prizes.
23. The winners of second and third place are awarded medals.

IX. FUNDING

24. The program is jointly funded by resources from NSA overseeing the Olympic, Paralympic, intellectual disability, and student sports movements, administered by the National Sports Agency under the Ministry of Education, Science, and Sports of the Republic of Lithuania.
25. The LSSA covers the costs of organizing and conducting the competition and provides awards for the teams.
26. Travel, accommodation, and meal expenses for the teams are covered by the sending organization.

X. PRE-REGISTRATION

27. Preliminary team registration (including the name of the higher education institution, names and surnames of participants, and the name and surname of the coach/team leader) must be sent by email to: valdemaras@imtynes.lt, with a copy to studentsportas@gmail.com, by April 10, 2026, 12:00.



XI. APPLICATIONS

28. Nominal and technical applications must be submitted by the specified deadline in the sports regulations to the Chief Referee of the sport or another responsible person designated in the regulations.
29. **Valid application:**
 - 29.1. The application must include the name of the organization, the full names of the athletes and the coach/team leader, and the event(s) individual or team — in which each athlete will participate.
 - 29.2. The application must be submitted with doctor's approval, individual health certificates for each athlete, or with the athlete personally taking responsibility for their own health, signed on the application form.
 - 29.3. The application must be approved by a representative of the organization being represented.
30. **Incorrect applications and/or unverified student status will be considered invalid.**
31. An athlete listed on the team application or registered individually and participating in the championship automatically agrees that their personal data (name, surname, university), photos, videos from the championship, and achieved results may be published on the LSSA website, social media channels, LSSA publications, and in the press.
32. All competition participants are obliged to comply with Anti-Doping rules.
33. Athletes or staff who do not agree to comply with the specified rules are not allowed to participate in the competition.
